1. REMINDER: Our St John's Church Annual Fair gig (18 Oct) - Set List

We have a 30-minute bracket in the church (wonderful acoustics). In past years we've always had a midmorning time slot; this year's program should be out soon. Our set's playing time is just over 28 minutes.

Check the 3 dot-points in Notes #3 under the set-list, to help you like about what pieces – and what parts of the less familiar pieces, i.e. the Barbella and Pleyel – you'd like to play on the day.

We'll use each Session up until the 18 October gig to work on all these pieces. Please see Notes #3 for information re Count-In, Tempo, Arrangement, Dynamics etc for all the pieces.

Today we worked our way through the set-list, playing each piece through at a slower than usual tempo, to ease Jackie back in gently and to give Peter a chance to sight-read the music and play wherever he felt able to. We played each piece through just once, but occasionally gave more attention to a bar or phrase here and there:

1. Suite in D Minor (GP Telemann)

Mvt 2: Gavottte Grotesque (3:15-3:23)

Mvt 4: *Menuet* (3:25-3:31)

Mvt 6: Louree (3:33-3:37)

2. **Barcarola 'Duo'** (C Munier) (3:39-3:55)

Trevor arrived half way through and joined the group on Mdla.

- 3. *Barcarole* (R Schulz) (3:57-4:03)
- 4. Sonata a Due Mandolini e Basso (E Barbella)

Mvt 1: Allegro 1 (4.13-4.17)

Mvt 2: Largo (4.17-4.21)

Mvt 3: Allegro 2 (4.21-4.25)

5. Allegro-Romanze-Rondo (I Pleyel)

Mvt 2: *Romanze* (4.28-4.43)

We played this Mvt first, as it is very slow (minim = 40, i.e. set your metronomes to 80 and count each bar '1 & 2 &', with a metronome 'tick' on each of the 4 counts). We could all see that this Mvt is simple and that everyone could be ready to play this on 18 Oct.

Mvt 1: Allegro (4.44-4.51)

We then went back to Mvt 1 and played bars 1-55 (we are calling this Section 'A') at a tempo slower than the tempo we'll be aiming for (crotchet = 130). Jackie had to leave at the end. All these bars (1-55) could well be played by students – give them some attention in your Home Practice and see what you think.

Mvt 3: *Rondo* (4.53-5.05)

We finished our Session/Rehearsal with this Mvt. It's a really pretty tune and is more straightforward than Mvt 1. We played bars 1-46 (we are calling this Section 'A') at a tempo slower than the tempo we'll be aiming for (dotted crotchet = 96). As per the Allegro, most or even all of this section could well be played by students – give this section some attention in your Home Practice too, and see what you think.

A solid Session again today, well done and thank you.

HOME PRACTICE – COZYMO and COZMO

Could you try to structure your Home Practice routine daily as follows over the next few weeks prior to the gig. If you can find 50-60 minutes each day that would be very helpful to your gaining confidence and accuracy:

- Play through the set-list each day, in set-list order. Include in your practice to pretend you're:
 - looking at Col for the final bar of each movement and each piece, and
 - watching him give us the count-in for each next piece (write at the top of each of your pieces).
- > Then focus on particular bars/phrases in the pieces you know need particular work.

Prior to the gig we have 4 more Sessions/Rehearsals: on 31 August and 7, 14 and 21 September (then end Term 3 and a 2-week term break). Term 4 begins on 12 October, with our gig on 18 October. We can organise some practise sessions during the term break if students would like to meet. For those absent for any of these dates, please do keep up with your daily **Home Practice**, as suggested above! Thank you.
